



UPDATE ON FISCAL YEAR 2026 APPROPRIATIONS PROCESS

CADCA shared a summary of the appropriations process for FY 2026. The Appropriation Bill for Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, and Related Agencies (LHHS) is one of 12 appropriation bills and is mainly responsible for providing for the agencies and programs needed for the primary substance prevention field. A breakdown of all requests by the President's Budget Requests and the House and Senate's proposals. These cuts and proposals are not final. The differences will be resolved in FY 2026 appropriations process.

CINC at Conference

CINC presented, *Braiding Funds & Leveraging Partnerships to Boost Impact in the Pharmacy Setting,* at CADCA's 24th Mid-Year Training in Nashville, TN and the National Prevention Network's prevention conference in Washington, DC. Holly Carter, Jane Casarez hosted Jane McDonald, Elizabeth Locklear, Ijeoma Uwakwe, Derrick Vickers, Ross Kiser, and Ashlie Smith. NPN showcased Devan Conley, Virginia Fagg, Brandy Letson, and Jodie Rodewald.

Participants were informed about the role of partnerships in developing and implementing a co-dispense project within the pharmacy setting, emphasizing collaboration between pharmacies, local prevention providers, and other community stakeholders. They learned strategies for braiding funding streams—including government funding, grants, and insurance reimbursements—to support and sustain a co-dispense model in pharmacy settings. Finally, attendees received actionable strategies, drawn from real-world examples in North Carolina communities, to create, enhance, or implement a co-dispense program that is both sustainable and effective in addressing community health needs.

The participants shared how they developed a pilot to co-dispense a disposal kit, a locking product, and an opioid antagonist with Opioid prescriptions at the point of sale in their pharmacies. A protocol was developed for participating pharmacies to adopt policies related to the co-dispense pilot project items and data collection. The participating pharmacists shared their experiences during the pilot program and the response from their communities.
