We're proud to share that Erin Jamieson Day, CEO of Community Impact NC, participated as a panelist at Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA)'s Prevention and Recovery Summit on August 25, 2026, in Washington, D.C.

The theme, "Collaboration and Coalition Building for a Stronger Continuum," brings together prevention and recovery leaders from across the country to: Enhance collaboration and partnerships across prevention and recovery communities. Identify service gaps, promising models, and priority actions to strengthen the continuum. Forge new and lasting partnerships among organizations, advocates, and public-sector partners.

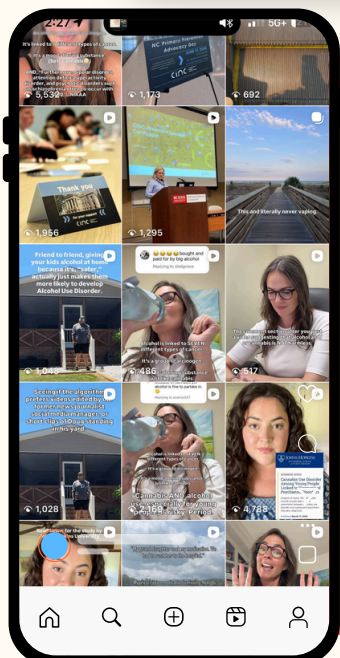
